

# Animal Report

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Choose an animal for your report. IT MUST BE A SURPRISE.  
You will share your report with the whole class. **You must complete activities 1-5.** For activity 6, **choose one** of the two options. The report must be hand written and include a nice cover.  
This whole report must be finished and at school by **May 18<sup>th</sup>**.

Layout of report:

## My Animal Report

1. Make a nice cover for your report.
2. Write a riddle about your animal. Give at least four clues so classmates can guess the animal. [This is why it needs to be a surprise!]
  - a. Example:
    - i. My animal is covered with short stiff hair.  
It walks on four legs.  
It has a curly tail.  
It has a flat nose.  
What is it? Answer: a pig
3. Draw and color (paint, crayons, pencils, etc. are okay) a picture of your animal. Color its babies. Color its food. Color its home.
4. Write a three paragraph essay to these questions. WRITE IN COMPLETE SENTENCES.

Layout:

### Introduction Paragraph:

- a. What is your animal? What are the babies called?
- b. What does it look like? What is your animal covered with [Does it have scales, fur, feathers, etc.]?
- c. How does your animal move?

### **Paragraph 1:**

- d. Is your animal wild or tame? What is its habitat? Where on earth does it live?
- e. What features does it have that make it special? How does it adapt to its environment?
- f. What does it eat?

### **Conclusion Paragraph:**

- g. Other information/Fun Facts about your animal
- h. Why did you choose this animal?

5. Write three math story problems about your animal. These will be read to the class to be solved by your classmates.

a. Examples:

- i. There were two dogs in the yard. How many legs in all?
- ii. There were 18 dogs but only 15 bones. How many dogs did not get a bone?
- iii. One dog had four puppies. Another dog had 6 puppies. How many puppies in all?

6. **Choose one** of these to complete.

- a. Make a model of your animal and its habitat
  - i. Use clay, paper mache, etc.
- b. Make a diorama showing your animal and where it lives.

## Things to remember

1. Your animal is a secret!!
2. Report is due May 18<sup>th</sup>
3. Everyone will read their report and show their projects in front of the class.
4. These reports must be hand written by the student using complete sentences.
5. Don't forget a cover!
6. **Grades will be based on the following:**
  - a. Report is written in a three-paragraph essay form. - 10 points
  - b. Each question is answered in full and in complete sentences. - 10 points
  - c. Math stories - 10 points each
  - d. Riddle - 10 points
  - e. Project completion (each part must be done) and creativity - 20 points
  - f. Oral presentation - 20 points
  - g. Neatness (spelling, punctuation, penmanship, coloring, etc.) 20 points.
